### **SPIRITUAL GIFTS** INVENTORY

"Now there are different gifts, but the same Spirit. There are different ministries, but the same Lord. And there are different activities, but the same God activates each gift in each person. A demonstration of the Spirit is given to each person to produce what is beneficial." 1 Corinthians 12:4-7 (HCSB)

This inventory is a list of spiritual gifts compiled from a number of resources, books, and online inventories. They are not intended to limit the Spirit but rather to enhance and acknowledge the special gifts of grace given by God to Christians.

The purpose of this inventory is for one to discover their spiritual gifts and then to prayerfully consider ways to utilize these gifts for the advancement of the Kingdom of God and the making of disciples in your life. These gifts are meant to be shared about, not stored away.

For the **best results** answer each statement below according to who you are, not who you would like to be or think you ought to be. How true are these statements of you? What has been your experience? What do others tell you? To what degree do these statements reflect your usual tendencies?

Each question is very important, so try not to miss out on any.

Respond to each statement according to the following 0-4 point scale:

0 = Never; Not true

1 = Rarely; Seldom true

2 = Some of the time; Occasionally true

3 = Most of the time; Usually true

4 = All of the time; Consistently true

**Administration** The gift to clearly understand the present and future goals of the Church and to plan workable and manageable ways to reach these goals. Ways to serve: help with planning events (such as Jr. Crew nights or summer events), "check in" person, VBS/Sports camp, or other leadership roles. 1 Corinthians 12:28, Acts 6:2-4, Exodus 18:13-27

**Craftsmanship** The gift to use hands, minds and skill to build up the Kingdom through artistic and creative means for the glory and honor of God. Ways to serve: creating art for Crew, mission trips, VBS decorations, joining the A/V team, or videos. *Exodus* 28:3-4, *Exodus* 31:1-5, *Acts* 18:3, 2 *Kings* 12:12

**Discernment** The gift to know and to test whether something is spiritually good or evil, from God or from Satan. Ways to serve: pray for church and leadership, talk to one the elders and shadow one, or join the prayer team. 1 John 4:1, 1 Kings 3:9, Romans 12:2, 1 Corinthians 2:14, Hebrews 5:14, Acts 5:3-6

**Encouragement** The gift to offer words and actions of encouragement to others in need of comfort, counsel, help in getting connected and care. Ways to serve: prayer team, Guest Services Team, or Serve ministry. *Romans 12:8, Acts 4:36, Acts 11:23-24, 1 Thessalonians 4:18* 

**Evangelism** The gift to share the Gospel with unbelievers with the hope that the unbeliever will become a disciple of Jesus Christ. Ways to serve: neighbor to neighbor, invite friends to church or Bible study, help in Go ministry. *Ephesians 4:11-12, 2 Timothy 4:5, Acts 21:8* 

**Faith** The gift to believe with extraordinary confidence in God's promises, power, and presence in order to honor God, inspire others, and build up the Church. Ways to serve: prayer teams, prayer encourager, participate and contribute in small group, talk to the elders and shadow one.

1 Corinthians 12:9, Hebrews 11:1, Hebrews 11:6, Philippians 3:9, Luke 17:5, Romans 10:17

**Giving** The gift to offer material blessings with exceptional willingness, cheerfulness, and generosity to the mission of the Church and people in need. Ways to serve: give on Sundays, share your testimony with others who may not understand why to give, participate or lead when the topic of stewardship comes up. *Romans* 12:6, *Romans* 12:8, *Mark* 12:43-44, 2 Corinthians 8:2-3, 2 Corinthians 9:7

**Helping** The gift to willingly assist others by enabling them to do their Kingdom tasks more effectively and to help bear the burdens of others. Ways to serve: look for needs in the bulletin, look for opportunities everyday to help everywhere, Houston Foodbank, Kids' ministry, Guest Services Team, mission trips, help your neighbors, food drive, join the Comfort Dog Team as a helper.

1 Corinthians 12:28, Acts 6:2-4, Psalm 40:17, Hebrews 13:6, 1 Timothy 5:10

**Hospitality** The gift to offer food, lodging, or fellowship to people in a cheerful manner either in their homes, work, school or church. Ways to serve: Guest Services Team, Welcome Teams, welcome people, or a hospitality team. 1 Peter 4:9-10, 1 Timothy 3:2, 1 Timothy 5:10, Romans 12:13, Titus 1:8

**Leadership** The gift to set goals from God and then lead others to work together to carry out these goals for the glory of God. Ways to serve: small group leader, Kids' Ministry leader, or work with youth ministry staff to organize events. *Romans 12:8, 1 Timothy 4:12, Hebrews 13:7* 

**Mercy** The gift of showing kindness and compassion in the name of Jesus to those who suffer. Desires to meet the needs of those who hurt. Ways to serve: Adults with disabilities ministries, volunteering at the nursing home, Comfort Dog Team, Trinity Cares Team, or helping in the food pantry. *Romans 12:8, Deut. 4:31, Matthew 5:7, Titus 3:5, Luke 6:36* 

**Missions** The gift of being 'sent forth' to minister in another culture, people group or nation, while utilizing a wide range of spiritual gifts. Ways to serve: pray for missionaries, join the mission board, go on mission trips (such as the Jr. High Mission to Houston, Alaska Mission, or Workcamps once you're in high school). *Matthew 28:18-20, Acts 1:8, 22:21, 1 Corinthians 9:19-23, Mark 13:10* 

**Pastoring** The gift to guide, oversee, shepherd and spiritually build-up a specific group of believers in matters concerning Christ and the Church. Ways to serve: elder, small group leader in Student or Kids Ministry, VBS. *Ephesians 4:11-12, 1 Peter 5:1-4, Jeremiah 23:4, Hebrews 13L17, 1 Timothy 3:2, John 10:11* 

**Serving** The gift to serve God and the Church with great joy, blessing, and selfless- ness. One who desires to meet physical, spiritual & emotional needs of others. Ways to serve: worship arts, food pantry, childcare, Guest Services Team, mission trips (such as the Jr. High Mission to Houston, Alaska Mission, or Workcamps once you're in high school). *Romans 12:7, Ephesians 3:7, Ephesians 4:12, Ephesians 6:7, Galatians 6:2, Philippians 2:7, Deuteronomy 10:12* 

**Teaching** The gift to communicate God's word to God's people in order that they might under- stand spiritual truths and insights and thus learn, grow, and mature in Jesus Christ. Ways to serve: small group leaders, Sunday School for Kids' Ministry, engage and participate in your small group, VBS. *Ephesians 4:11-12, 1 Corinthians 12:29, Romans 12:7, Acts 11L25-26, Acts 13:1, Acts 15L35, John 7:16* 

## SPIRITUAL GIFTS ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Spiritual gifts exist within every Christian. They are the ways by which Christ works within the life of believers to edify and strengthen the Church. Through these gifts we bring glory and honor to God and bless believers and nonbelievers alike. They are gifts to be shared. They are not gifts to be hidden or tucked away in a closet, or enclosed within a box. They are given by the Spirit to be used by the Spirit. The origin of these special gifts never begins with humanity but always with the divine. God is the giver of these gifts.

Four main passages in Scripture provide the foundation for spiritual gifts. They include: Romans 12:6-8, 1 Corinthians 12 and 14, Ephesians 4:7-12, and 1 Peter 4:9-11. Many of the gifts listed in this inventory also come from other places in Scripture not mentioned above.

### Why Identify Spiritual Gifts?

- 1. It helps you determine God's will for your vocation. A knowledge of your gifts will provide a context for making career and ministry decisions regarding what not to attempt as well as what to enter into with confidence.
- 2. Mobilizes the entire church for mission. Since a small percentage of the church consists of clergy and more than ninety percent of the church is laity, the church obviously must equip and encourage every Christian to minister in his or her area of influence, home, school or work place.
- 3. Assists you in setting priorities for study, growth, and ministry. Since each of us has a limited amount of time to develop our potential, it seems clear that we should develop ourselves in the areas of our spiritual gifts.
- 4. Gives each Christian a sense of dignity and self-worth. Every Christian is an important part of the total church. There are no "second class" citizens in the Christian community because each person is a vitally important member of the body of Christ.
- 5. Enables you to receive the gift ministries of others. When Christians become more knowledgeable of their own spiritual gifts and those of other Christians, they can more easily function in harmony as the body of Christ, both giving and receiving ministries.
