
The Apostles' Creed (in a nutshell)

- Answer the question: Who is God?
 - o Once you come to appreciate what God has done, you come to discover who He is.
 - o God is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- The Apostles' Creed
 - o Who are the Apostles? The original Twelve Disciples (minus Judas Iscariot) and Paul.
 - o Named not because they wrote it but because it's a summary of their teaching.
 - o Creed is a word that means "I believe."
 - We recognize three creeds
 - o Broken into three "articles": Father (1st), Son (2nd), and Holy Spirit (3rd)
- The Trinity ("the Greatest Mystery of the Christian Faith")
 - o Important verses: Matthew 28:19 and Deuteronomy 6:4
 - o The Shield of the Trinity



- Three ways God has revealed Himself to us:
 - Creation
 - o Our conscious
 - The Scriptures







- God our Father
 - o Why do we call Him Father? Jesus does, we're adopted, and He provides.
 - He's the "Maker of heaven and earth"
 - Implications about God: it all belongs to Him, He's independent, He's powerful
 - Implications about creation: it's dependent, God wanted it
- Who is Jesus?
 - o He was promised in Genesis 3:15 (John 1 is pretty fun, too!)
 - o His name: Jesus means "Savior" and Christ means "Anointed One" or "Messiah"
 - o Here's a quick way to summarize His life: He came, he died, He rose, He Ascended, He's Coming Back
 - He is 100% God, 100% Man or "True God, True Man"—we refer to this as the "Two Natures of Christ"
 - o Fulfilled Old Testament roles of Prophet, Priest, and King (all who would have been thought of as "messiahs" or "anointed ones"; but Jesus is *the* Messiah.)
 - Humiliation and Exaltation
- Who is the Holy Spirit? A life giver, a gift giver, a fruit producer, a gatherer, a forgiveness and grace giver, and a resurrector.
